

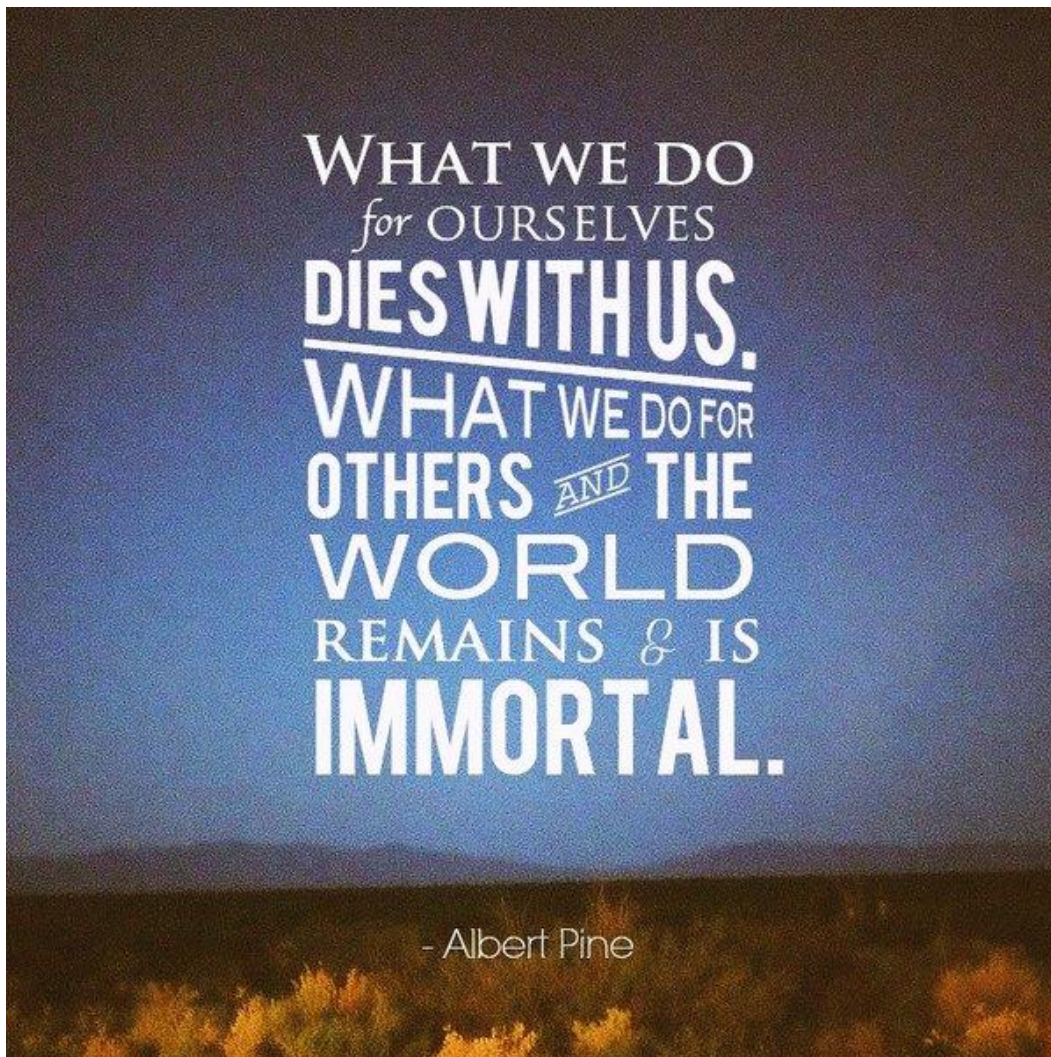

SHAL OUTREACH Service Summary Report

SHAL's hard working outreach staff **Teresa Wallace**, and **Anne Barnett** provided **150 services**



to **80 clients** in March, both sheltered and unsheltered, with an average of 2 service per client. 6 clients were provided birth certificate assistance, we assisted 28 clients get a Florida ID and 2 clients were referred for health care/dental/mental health services. We helped 9 clients obtain food stamps/medicaid.

SHAL Outreach did *intakes* on **22** new or existing clients.

Success Stories

Thanks to grant funding from the **Monroe County Continuum of Care (COC)**, 4 clients were successfully relocated to better situations, where they have housing, support and/or employment waiting for them.

SHAL assisted 8 clients in obtaining a New or replacing their cell phones so that they can continue their job searches.

SHAL assisted 1 client obtain shoes and clothing that were necessary for her new job.

One of our clients is working on getting her Medical Assistant license by starting classes at FKCC. She was offered a job at Bayshore Manor. SHAL was able to help by giving her a VOH to cover her application fee. Keep up the good work

One of our clients came in several months ago without ID, phone and a place to stay. He was very upset at his circumstance. SHAL helped obtained his Birth Certificate so he could get his ID. Then we worked to get his phone. He moved into KOTS and started looking for work, which he found quickly. He now has a steady job and has moved out of KOTS this month. Congratulations!

SHAL SHELTER OPERATIONS – KOTS

Under the direction of Shelter Manager **Chris Sparrow** and Shelter Supervisor **Luis Ortiz**, the database shows that Shelter staff did **42** New Intakes for the month of March. The total number of clients (unduplicated) that stayed in March was **118**. Additionally, SHAL's Shelter staff served **4,938** meals, both Breakfast and Dinner, to SHAL Shelter residents. Dinner is provided by the volunteers at **St. Mary's Soup Kitchen** and delivered by SHAL volunteers who pick up the pans and bring them out to the Shelter, and breakfast is provided by SHAL.
